4.	Councillor assisted by the Manager: Wholesale Services and the External Consultant, presented the submission.  Council Comments:  4.1. Council sought clarity on what the report meant when it states that "the market failure was due to high sunk costs and barriers to entry". The Committee advised that this alludes to the very high initial investment required for a player seeking to compete with Sentech, which has impeded new entry.  4.2. Council noted that the memorandum erroneously stated that the inquiry was initiated in terms of section 4C(6) of the ICASA Act, when it was actually in terms of section 4B of the ICASA Act.  4.3. The Committee highlighted that, whilst some broadcasting end-users utilise other available options such as satellite and internet to stream content, there are factors / barriers to these channels, such as the high cost of data. This may be indicative that the signal distribution market will likely not drastically change in the next three (3) years in favour of the Internet or satellite.  4.4. The Committee indicated that it had been advised by the external attorneys not to include the remedies in the Findings document.  4.5. Council noted that the next stage is to consult on possible remedies pursuant to section 67(4) of the ECA.  Council resolved to approve the recommendation.	Clir
