### APPLICATION FOR RENEWAL OF INDIVIDUAL COMMERCIAL SOUND BROADCASTING SERVICE LICENSE (I-CSBS)

I write on behalf of the applicant and wish to submit the following individual commercial sound broadcasting service renewal applications.

#### 1. BACKGROUND TO THE APPLICATION

The applicant in this application is Extriserve Pty Ltd which is trading as LM RADIO® issued with an INDIVIDUAL BROADCASTING SERVICE LICENCE on the 18<sup>th</sup> of July 2014. The station has a footprint covering greater Gauteng area, defined by ICASA coverage map, covering beyond the borders of Gauteng into parts of the provinces of Mpumalanga, the Free State and Kwazulu Natal.

The station was placed in voluntary business rescue on 30 November 2021. The reasons were, among others, the effect of COVID-19 and the associated cost-cutting measures on advertising spend which affected the financial affairs of the licensee as well as due to management issues that have contributed to the station's financial woes.

The business rescue process was conducted over a period of more than two years during which time management made an offer to transfer the license to another legal entity, which was ultimately not carried through. This caused the station additional financial stress, damage to the brand and contributed unnecessary delays to the business rescue outcome.

During the time that the applicant was under business rescue, it continued its operation (albeit limited) in view of a possible business recue as a second round of offers were invited and an offer was accepted that effectively rescue the applicant and not destroy its legacy. This second

offer provided new investment and implemented proactive management interventions aimed at effectively rescuing the business and securing of jobs. This second offer in the end was carried through under the business rescue process and restored back in business.

### 2. CURRENT LEGAL POSITION OF THE APPLICANT

During the period in which the applicant was in business rescue, the operation was placed under a caretaker management as from March 2023. The caretaker management strengthened the operation and managed to secure and sustain the employment of all of the staff members (with the exception of the station manager) and in addition managed to fill an additional three positions to secure the job opportunities of total 17 personnel members. The applicant was rescued and restored back into business starting January 2024. The shareholding of the applicant did not change as a result of the rescue and shareholding remains the same as at the time the license was awarded.

### 3. RADIO TRANSMISSION ON MEDIUM WAVE BAND (MW)

The applicant is broadcasting in the Medium Wave band (on frequency 702kHz AM) and despite the fact that MW frequencies are affected by various sources of interference, including the increasing number of electronic devices and appliances, and comments made by others that MW is considered an outmoded technology, it is the applicant opinion that MW with its better coverage is still a suitable sound broadcasting platform in South Africa in order to serve a diverse audience ranging from metropolitan and rural communities within its coverage area.

With the new investment during the business rescue, also the inclusion of experienced engineering capabilities in the AM broadcasting field, the applicant is well funded and has secured the necessary skills to take it forward. The applicant (through its technology partner, Broadcom International cc) has secured a long term lease agreement with Sentech, where Broadcom is to provide the active operational and maintenance functions at the Welgedacht AM transmission site in support of Sentech's contributions as the facility/site owner.

### 4. DIGITAL SOUND BROADASTING (DRM) VISION of the APPLICANT

The applicant with support from its technology partner is planning to embark on implementing a digital sound broadcast demonstration service on DRM in the Medium Wave broadcast band (simulcasting) in accordance with ICASA guidelines. This will be done in liaison with and in cooperation with community broadcasters (also is broadcasting on MW) as well as with support from Sentech and with relevant technology partners (e.g. DRM SA Group, SADIBA) and others.

The MW broadcast band is currently underutilised due to challenges setting up and the operation of MW transmission, however MW coupled to the benefits offered by digital sound broadcast technology offers a new set of broadcast opportunities that is well suited for a developing country. Our technology partner consulted with Sentech who has expressed their support for the implementation of a DRM demonstration broadcast in the Medium Wave band.

This would fulfil several of the Authority's objects as set out in the ECA including:

- "(d) encourage investment, including strategic infrastructure investment, and innovation in the communications sector;
- (e) ensure efficient use of the radio frequency spectrum; (m) promote broad-based black economic empowerment, with particular attention to the needs of women ...;

- (k) ensure that broadcasting services...viewed collectively, are provided by persons or groups of persons from a diverse range of communities in the Republic;
- (I) provide assistance and support towards human resource development within the ICT sector; (p) develop and promote SMMEs and co-operatives;
- (s) ensure that broadcasting services, viewed collectively (i) promote the provision and development of a diverse range of sound and television broadcasting services on a national, regional and local level, that cater for all languages and cultural groups and provide entertainment, education and information ...
- (v) ensure that commercial and community broadcasting licences, viewed collectively, are controlled by persons or groups of persons from a diverse range of communities in the Republic; (w) ensure that broadcasting services are affectively controlled by South Africans;
- (z) promote stability in the JCT sector."

#### 5. OUR APLLICATION

Form E and P with the relevant annexures is enclosed for the Authority's consideration and approval. As indicated in the application, the applicant is substantially empowered and will further implement <a href="mailto:meaningful">meaningful</a> empowerment by the inclusion of the Veterans Broadcaster's Forum (NPC) with equity shareholding, and will be managed by people with extensive experience in sound broadcasting.

Furthermore, the license renewal will give effect to the requirements of section 31 (4) of the ECA (read with section 10) as well as section 2, in securing the efficient and effective use of radio frequency spectrum and because the license renewal will give effect to a request which is fair and will not prejudice other licensees.

#### 6. LATE SUBMISSION OF RENEWAL APPLICATION

We humbly request the authority to pardon our late submission which was a result the drawnout business rescue process and the uncertainties that has hampered and made the rescue outcome uncertain until as recently as January 2024. Following the business rescue a new board had to be appointed and recorded at CIPC and the applicant had to engage with Sentech in order to secure the transmission facilities going forward. The deliberations with Sentech could only start after the business rescue had been completed and have managed (through our technology partner) only as recently as the 18th March 2024 to engage with Sentech regarding the future usage of the Welgedacht AM transmitter site.

### 7. COMPLIANCE

The new management noticed a number of compliance shortcomings. These include inter ala failure to submit financial statements at the end of the 2022/23 financial year (while being in business rescue) as well as the fact that the business recue final <u>dividend distribution account</u> is not yet being finalised, thus preventing the applicant to finalise the financial statements for 2023/24. The new management is making an honest undertaking in that all the shortcomings which will be handled appropriately.

### CONCLUSION

While we know that South Africa remains a developing country and that the diverse nature of our population demographics is deserving of a more diverse licensing and broadcasting landscape, we do believe that continued support of the underutilised MW broadcasting band is highly recommended.

When ICASA awarded the licence along with the format to Extriserve in 2014, based on Extriserve research and commitments, it showed and demonstrated the need for the broadcast of entertainment and information that is still very much in demand and continues to be attractive to advertisers. Underperforming business management and operational issues of the licensee in the past was as a result inconsistencies on the side of earlier management of the company.

By allowing this format to continue in the hands of a new, substantially empowered and financially supported shareholding group, the Authority will promote competition, ensure the effective and diverse use of spectrum and retaining listeners and advertising on a the well supported brand of LM RADIO.



### 4. Broadcast Language

The Licensee's principal language of broadcast shall be English.

### 5. Format

- 5.1 The Licensee shall have a programming format of 75% "golden oldie" and nostalgic adult contemporary music.
- 5.2 The Licensee's programming format shall be supported by a speech content which shall comprise of a mixture of informative discussion and news related to lifestyle, music content, information, travel, weather, and public-service messages of no more than 25%, ranging from 10-15% during peak times and 5-10% during off-peak times. The Licensee's peak times shall be 6h00 to 9h00 and 16h00 to 18h00 on weekdays.

### 6. Local Content Obligations

The Licensee shall broadcast 25% of South African music.

### 7. General Programming Obligations

- 7.1 The Licensee shall broadcast news bulletins at peak times during weekdays at 6h00, 7h00, 8h00, 17h00 and 18h00. The Licensee shall broadcast news for a total of thirty (30) minutes per day. The Licensee shall broadcast a weekly average of 25% news from Gauteng area, 35% national news and 40% international news.
- 7.2 The Licensee will broadcast its news in English.
- 7.3. Should the Licensee source news material from a source other than itself, the source(s) thereof shall be disclosed to the Authority.
- 7.4 The Licensee shall broadcast community events relating to its coverage area.

### 8. Ownership and control structures of the Licensee

Until the publication of ownership and control regulations, the Licensee shall for the duration of this licence maintain at least thirty per cent (30%) ownership and control of the station by persons from historically disadvantaged groups.

### 9. Promise of Performance

- 9.1 The Licensee shall employ a local news team specifically for the production of local news.
- 9.2 At least 70% of the employees employed by the Licensee shall be historically disadvantaged persons from the licensed coverage area.
- 9.3 The Licensee shall establish an employee training programme and shall spend a minimum of R1 116 000 (one million one hundred and sixteen thousand rand) over the licence period.

- 9.4 The Licensee shall assist in the development of broadcasting knowledge and skills amongst historically disadvantaged groups in the industry by "adopting" at least one (1) community sound broadcaster within the broadcasting coverage areas and provide them with, among other things, managerial and technical training through holding workshops and hand-on experiential training at LM Radio.
- 9.5 The Licensee shall provide the following amount annually to be used for annual broadcasting sound engineering, journalism training, programme presenting and production, sale and marketing, and news gathering internship(s) to persons from historically disadvantaged groups from the licensed coverage area:


